



Distribution of the Urgent Response Fund: Explanatory notes

This document is intended to be read alongside the regional reports on the distribution of the Urgent Response Fund.

Total number of learners supported

The total number of learners supported is based on the number of learners that was provided on funding applications.

Some learners were supported by multiple applications, which means that the total number of learners supported listed against an institution might be greater than the number of learners on their roll.

Primary category of need

URF applications are categorised by the primary need that the application is intending to meet. The four categories of need are:

- Attendance
- Wellbeing to support attendance
- Cultural wellbeing to support attendance
- Re-engagement in learning

Institutions may have multiple funded applications under each category, but each category will only be listed once against an institution.

Institutions which cover more than one region

Institutions are funded through regional URF allocations, based on the geographical location of the learners supported. Institutions which cover more than one education region may have received funding from more than one regional URF allocation and therefore appear in more than one region's reports. For example, Te Aho o Te Kura Pounamu is New Zealand's main distance education provider and has learners all over the country.

Data withheld for privacy reasons

If the total number of learners is less than five, the number is not specified to protect the privacy of the learners. For some institutions, it has been necessary to list cluster funding as a separate line in the All Funded Institutions report to apply data masking.

Details on a small number of institutions funded are being withheld to protect the privacy of the learners. The total value of this funding is included but no other information.
