Thank you for your email of 31 May 2019 to the Ministry of Education requesting the following information:

1. *All correspondence between the Ministry of Education and HLC (Homes Land Community) regarding the funding or resourcing of Te Papapa School, Oranga Primary School, and One Tree Hill College.*
2. *The minutes, notes, or resulting action points of all meetings between Ministry of Education and HLC, including but not limited to the quarterly meetings.*

Your request has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

All correspondence between the Ministry of Education and HLC (Homes Land Community) regarding the funding or resourcing of Te Papapa School, Oranga Primary School, and One Tree Hill College.

We have identified two documents falling in scope of this part of your request. These are attached as **Document One** and **Two**. I am withholding some information from the documents under section 9(2)(a) to protect the privacy of natural persons. I have identified no public interest considerations favouring the release of the withheld information at this time. Information out of scope of this part of your request has also been removed.

The minutes, notes, or resulting action points of all meetings between Ministry of Education and HLC, including but not limited to the quarterly meetings.

Ministry officials meet regularly (at least quarterly) with HLC. Ministry and HLC officials attended a Strategic Relationship Meeting in December 2018. It was agreed at that meeting that the HLC team should encourage schools to use their regular channels to discuss specific school issues. An action point was raised and the response to this is attached as **Document 2A**. This is the only relevant reference recorded in minutes.

Please note, the Ministry now proactively publishes OIA responses on our website. As such, we may publish this response on our website after five working days. Your name and contact details will be removed.

s 9(2)(a) OIA At the recent HLC/MOE Mt Roskill meeting I advised that the person to contact regarding discussion of resourcing for schools in areas of change was [REDACTED].

Please contact [REDACTED] in the first instance.

It would be useful to fully understand how the phasing of HLC projects is likely to result in temporary drops in HNZ tenant numbers and possible drops in school rolls. Likewise, we need to understand the likely rapid rise in tenancies and school rolls once stage 1 and 2 developments are complete. It would be helpful if you can outline the sequence for us and the timeframes involved. We are aware that HLC plans to ramp up projects over time and initial affects are due to decanting issues. These affects have possible resourcing implications for schools adjacent to HLC large scale developments, and we need to be able to manage this.


