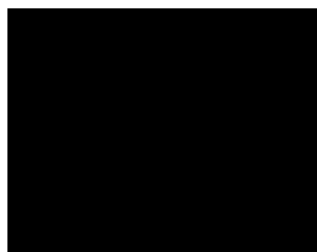

Thank you for your email of 16 March 2018 to the Ministry of Education requesting the following information:

- 1. The number of new schools being built in Auckland and their locations (could you please break down the number of new schools, what kind of school they are e.g. primary, secondary etc. specifically to their locations)*
- 2. The expected completion of new schools being built in Auckland (could the expected completion be broken down to the new school and its location)*
- 3. How many students can each new school enrol in total (could this be broken down by each new school and its location)*
- 4. How many schools in Auckland over the last five years have been shut down and the names of each school*
- 5. How many schools in Auckland have been consolidated/merged and the names of which schools have merged with which school*
- 6. The names of private schools in Auckland and the number each of these private schools have in regards to projects underway that will create more classrooms/additional teaching spaces as well as the expected date of completion*
- 7. The current student population of private schools in Auckland that were mentioned above (could this please be broken down by name of school and student population)*
- 8. The names of public schools in Auckland and the number of each of these public schools have in regards to projects underway that will create more classrooms/additional teaching spaces as well as the expected date of completion*
- 9. The current student population of public schools in Auckland that were mentioned above (could this please be broken down by name of school and student population)*

Your request has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act). I apologise for the time it has taken to respond to your request. Unfortunately we underestimated the amount of time required to finalise our consultation and signoff process.

With regards to parts four and five of your request, three private schools have closed: Hebron Christian School, Immanuel Christian School and The Corelli School. No state schools have closed, and two schools, Carlson School and Sunnyside Special School, have merged to become one school operating as Central Auckland Special School.

Managers of private schools are fully responsible for their property and the Ministry does not record data on their building projects. I am therefore refusing parts six and seven of your request under section 18(g) of the Act, as the information is not held by the Ministry. As part of the private school registration process, the Ministry needs to be satisfied that the premises are suitable for a school of its description and for the number of students, and that all building legislation is complied with.

For the remaining parts of your request, I have attached two tables to this response as **Appendix A:**

- *Table one* outlines the roll growth in Auckland, broken down by school, suburb, school type, the number of roll growth classrooms and the school roll and estimated completion date. As the 2018 school roll return data has not been finalised, 2017 data has been provided. In addition to this an announcement will be made in the coming weeks on the final allocation of Budget 2017 roll growth classrooms.
- *Table two* outlines the number of new schools being built in Auckland, when they are estimated to open and their student capacity. The Auckland region has been defined as being from Wellsford to Pukekohe.

Further funding allocations have been made to address Auckland roll growth in Budget 2018 and these are currently being worked through.
