Thank you for your email of 14 November 2018 to the Ministry of Education requesting the following information:

You have provided information about those [Professional Learning and Development]
providers who were able to navigate your new invoicing system correctly. However,
there appears to be a number of providers who have not made this transition smoothly.
Please indicate the number of providers and the amount invoiced, but not paid within
usual terms, for each month this year.

Your request has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

The Ministry's Professional Learning and Development team has worked hard with providers and schools to smooth, stream line and address issues. It is important to note that where issues have occurred there have been a number of reasons that may have caused this, and may have not been entirely our systems.

I am providing you with two tables detailing all invoices paid for Professional Learning and Development (PLD) providers in P2P since March 2018. I have attached these to this response as **Appendix A**.

Please note, the Ministry now proactively publishes OIA responses on our website. As such, we may publish this response on our website after five working days. Your name and contact details will be removed.

Appendix A
