Puppets are a way for children to act out events and other people. Puppets can be bought or you can involve children in making their own. Puppets can be used on the finger, the hand, on a string or on a stick.

## Te Whāriki

Puppets can be used to support learning across all strands of Te Whäriki. In particular, they support the Communication strand, where children discover and develop different ways to be creative and expressive. Puppets can be used for telling and retelling stories.

## (1) Puppets can help children to

- develop hand, eye, arm, finger and body coordination
- be creative and expressive
- express moods and feelings
- begin to develop storytelling skills, tell stories and share ideas, play with words and movements.


## Adults can support children by

- talking to them about their puppet play
- helping them make their own puppets
- telling them stories that can then be retold using the puppets
- telling the stories or rhymes while the children act them out
- helping with music and props
- providing a range of interesting puppets and puppet-making materials
