Over this quarter, we experienced a decline in attendance rates from 86.1% in Q1 to 77.9% in Q2. A small cohort of 22/138 students or 16% had less than 80% attendance rate. The low attendance rates ranged from only 30 to 79% which also translated into an increase of unjustified absences. The main reasons for absences out of this group of students are due to truancy 68%, serious sickness 14%, at risk behaviour 18%. The Sponsor's commitment to strengthening our pastoral team is now making a more positive impact whereby we are beginning to see an improvement in term 3.

Ministry Quarterly grant was higher this quarter at \$648,287 and we received other school support funds this quarer and school donations leading to the \$670,394. We also had additional costs this last quarter with more staffing resources, school activities, catering expenses and governance expenses. There were no major surprises and we were able to generate a \$29,646 surplus for the quarter for a 4.4% Operating Surplus which is on track within the contract performance requirements.

Working Capital Ratio (Target: at least 2:1)

The Working Capital Ratio includes a school's ability to meet their short-term financial obligations through sound financial operation. Our Working Capital Ratio is strong at 7.4:1 well above the Target of 2:1. Again mainly due to PPAT carrying a strong cash position due to initial funding held to spread any capital/leasehold improvements over several years as the school grows. Current liabilities grew this quarterly due main to timing of creditors, accounts payable and staff leave entitlemenets increasing due to staff numbers increasing this corporate year.

We carry our original set up costs in an income in advance liability acocunt and we draw down from this account into revenues as we need to spend of capitalisation/leashold improvement. So it is a fund we fundamental owe to ourselves and represents \$580,646 of the Total liabilities mount. So while we are above the 0.50:1 ratio at 0.70:1, but the more correct ratio would be closer to 0.2:1 which is very healthy.
