Reasons for change in Working Capital & Operating Cash. Operating Cash for the quarter is (\$319,143) due to cash intended for 3rd Quarter was received in the 2Q amounting to \$232,662. Income in Advance was recognized in Q2. Other Current Liabilities reduced by \$74,000. Sundry Creditor in 3rd Quarter was decreased by \$45,000 compared to Q2 and GST payable in 2Q is \$31,000. Q3 GST Refund of \$2,700. Accrued Expenses is increased by \$10,000 (5 days wages for Sept paid in Oct). Accounts Payable is decreased by \$7,500 in the 3Q.

Debt Service Coverage Ratio
