This is our first year of operation so still in our initial operating phase. Budgets are being reviewed quarterly to ensure we are keeping on track with our financial obligations.

Working Capital Ratio (Standard: at least 2:1)

Our positive cashflow for this quarter is due to careful management of expenditure against incoming cash.

Debt Service Coverage Ratio
