The 1st quarter report had a forecast surplus of \$1,584. In April 2018 after the 1st Q report submitted to the MOE, the school revised the forecast/budget to reflect the actual expenses for the rest of the year. By revisiting the school budget/forecast, the financial results will be negative due to decline in revenue as a results of decline of school roll and fixed cost remains the same. Forecast Lease Payments decreased from 2Q to 3Q due to Equipment Leases on computers were transfer to Te Kapehu Whetu from Tuakana. Actual deficit in Q3 is greater than forecast due to declining student roll as a results of declining student roll due to uncertainity of the future of the school.
