The suspension and exclusion were placed on one student over the same incident.

SUSPENSION NOTES: The suspension was necessary due to serious violent threats over Facebook causing the opponents coming to the school grounds putting other students and staff at risk of danger. Staff initiated school lockdown procedures and called the Police. I met with the family on 26 May 2016, suspension took effect on the same day.

EXCLUSION NOTES: After 2 meetings with the family, the Board decided to exclude the student on the grounds of (3) Likely to cause serious harm (s14(1)(b) of the Education Act 1989) and (1) Continual Disobedience. The Sponsor is satisfied that they and the Co-Principals have followed the correct procedures as outlined in the Ministry guidelines and MOE staff support team.
