The withdrawals were accounted as follows: 6 students moved suburbs and enrolled at other schools, 4 older students entered into full time courses toward their vocational pathways, 1 student left school for full time employment. Although it is not ideal to lose students at this stage of the year, the school continues to accept new enrolments.

Expenses were maintained below budget mainly attributed to no external courses expenditure this term for Year 12 students. These to major factors resulted in a good performance outside the Operating Surplus % range.

PASS in in a strong Working Capital ratio, partly due to maintaining initial set up funiding to be expended over several years as the school grows and maintaining good fiscal responsibilities in maintaining current liabilities in acocunts payable, Wages/Salary Acrrual mainly owning to Annual leave entitlements, IRD accruals for PAYE and GST.

A debt ratio is used to measure an entity's financial leverage, calculated by dividing total liabilities by equity. The D/E ratio indicates how much debt a company is using to finance its assets relative to the amount of value represented in equity. A number lower than 1 indicates that the entity has taken on manageable debt levels and has a low risk, and the lower the number the less risk the entity is exposed to.

While the surplus added to the Quity value for the quarter PASS was carrying a slightly higher liabilitiy level due to timing of GST Payable in the third quarter. However, the sponsors are comfortable with this level of debt to equity given that a significant part of the liabilities relates to income in advance from the partnership school set up costs in order to spread the development over several years as the school build up.
