It aims to produce productive citizens for New Zealand as well as meet the Governments aim of having 85% of school leavers hold NCEA Level 2. Here is the data on the 28 school leavers for the quarter. Destinational outcomes were 17 Employed, 6 doing further education or courses, 4 attending another school and 1 unknown. Educational acheivements were 5 with NCEA Level 3, 18 with NCEA Level 2, 2 with NCEA Level 1 and 3 with no qualification.
