







MĀORI STUDENTS ENROLLED IN QUALIFICATIONS AT BACHELORS LEVEL OR HIGHER



WE HAVE SEEN IMPROVEMENTS AT BACHELOR LEVEL; 28% OF MĀORI STUDENTS WERE ENROLLED IN BACHELOR DEGREES OR HIGHER IN 2012 UP FROM 21% IN 2007

A SIGNIFICANT PROPORTION OF STUDENTS ARE STUDYING AT LOWER LEVELS (NZQF 1–3), HOWEVER MANY DO NOT COMPLETE A QUALIFICATION



THE NUMBER OF MĀORI STUDENTS PARTICIPATING AT NZQF LEVEL 4 AND ABOVE HAS INCREASED



- There have been strong improvements in Māori students' participation and qualification attainment.
- Although, not exclusive to Māori students, these improvements provide a strong foundation for further growth in Māori students' participation and achievement.
- There is still much more to be done.
- (a) Ka Hikitia Accelerating Success aims to support Māori students' in achieving and participating at or above the level of the total population.
