Who will use this checklist?

Te Puna Hanganga, Matihiko personnel such as Delivery Managers, Construction Observers, School Property Advisors and external Project Managers undertake visits to school property works or project sites as part of their role. As the Ministry's (Te Puna Hanganga, Matihiko) representatives there is a need to ensure their personal safety and to monitor aspects of health and safety practices they may observe while on the site visit. Conduct a minimum of one checklist for each live site per month and email the completed checklist to TPHM.healthandsafety@education.govt.nz
