Background

- The Auckland Education Reserves Trust (the trust) is administered by the Public Trust, and its assets are vested in the Public Trust.
- Section 4 of the Auckland Education Reserves Act 1912 (the 1912 Act) requires the Public Trust to disburse surplus income from certain trust properties in central Auckland to the Council of the University of Auckland
- 3 Section 16 (3) of the Reserves and Other Lands Disposal Act 1940 requires the Minister of Education to determine the amount to be disbursed. This is a routine annual process which you last approved in February 2020 [ER-2020-METIS-1219007].
- The University Council has an ongoing resolution that will use the disbursed funds for the purposes outlined in sections 4(a) and 4(b)(i) of the 1912 Act. This section of the Act requires the Council to spend one third of the funds on hostel maintenance and allow two-thirds to be spent on a range of activities to build and improve hostels.

Proposed 2021 disbursement

On 4 February 2021, Audrey Yang (Senior Client Advisor, Public Trust) wrote to you, proposing that you make a determination for the Public Trust to disburse \$514,000 of surplus Trust Income (held as at 30 April 2020) to the University Council. The Ministry supports the proposed disbursement.

Next Steps

We recommend that you authorise the Public Trust to disburse \$514,000 to the Council, by signing the attached letter to Audrey Yang (Annex 1).

Proactive release

We intend to proactively release this report as per your expectation that information be released as soon as possible. Any information that may need to be withheld will be withheld in line with the provisions of the Official Information Act 1982.
