#### Background

- The Ngarimu VC and 28<sup>th</sup> (Māori) Battalion Memorial Scholarship Fund Board (the Board) usually meets three times per year in March/April, August and October and runs the Scholarships Awards event (the Event) on the same day as the first meeting of the year.
- 2. This year's Event was originally scheduled for 18 March at Te Papaiouru Marae in Rotorua.
- 3. Due to COVID restrictions and concerns for guest wellness the Board agreed to postpone the Event to the 10 June 2022 to coincide with its Board meeting at Waitangi.
- 4. The move to Waitangi also aligns with the opening of the video taonga project at Te Rau Aroha.

- 6. We have consulted with Dr Te Tuhi Robust on the MC role and Company A invites. If you agree, Julian Wilcox, a Company A whānau member will be approached to MC events on the day. Dr Te Tuhi is compiling his invite recommendations and we will forward these to your office once received.
- 7. At the officials' hui on Wednesday 30 March, we agreed to produce this briefing note outlining a draft run sheet and invitation list for the event and an outline of the rest of the day. Please note the Te Whare Rūnanga has a capacity of 125 pax. The invitation list currently exceeds this number, but we are anticipating some declines (usually around 80% accept). We also will need to factor in the Waitangi Waiata Group (approximately 6 pax).
- 8. Dr Robust has let us know that A Company are holding a *Hora Ka Taki Show and Tell the Gum Diggers* at Waitangi the following day. He has extended an invitation to the Board and Secretariat to attend the hui run by the 28<sup>th</sup> Māori Battalion (A Company) Taitokerau Association. The hui is to inform A Company of the book being written for A Company history. Whānau are invited to bring taonga/memorabilia along.
