### **Proposal**

1. I am seeking Cabinet's agreement to submit the *Education (Early Childhood Services)*Amendment Regulations (No 2) 2021 (the Amendment Regulations) to the Executive Council.

### Consultation on draft regulations to require minimum percentages of qualified homebased educators

- 2. In June 2021, Cabinet agreed to issue drafting instructions and start public consultation on draft Amendment Regulations relating to home-based early childhood education services. These draft regulations were intended to give effect to previous Cabinet decisions to move to a qualified home-based educator workforce by 2025.
- 3. The draft Amendment Regulations:
  - create a requirement for educators in home-based ECE services to hold an approved ECE qualification
  - introduce requirements for unqualified educators to be training towards a required qualification for up to two years, or in an induction period of up to six months, from 1 January 2025
  - introduce minimum percentages of qualified educators that will apply to homebased services, which will progressively increase over the next four years until 1 January 2025, after which all educators must be either qualified or in training or in induction
  - setting parameters around how the minimum percentages of qualified educators will apply, by establishing a week-by-week basis for their application and certain restrictions on which educators can count
  - creating a requirement for home-based services to maintain a list of educators and evidence of their qualifications for each licence.

#### Minor changes are recommended based on consultation feedback

- 4. The Ministry of Education conducted public consultation on the draft Amendment Regulations from 27 August to 27 September 2021.
- 5. Consultation feedback was largely positive. I only consider it necessary to make the following minor amendments:
  - delaying the commencement date of the Amendment Regulations to 1 June 2022.
     This reflects the impact of COVID-19 on educators who are studying and would provide more time for service providers and educators to meet the minimum qualification requirements
  - recognising overseas ECE qualifications assessed by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority (NZQA) as comparable to an approved ECE qualification
  - providing educators actively studying towards a Level 7 ECE teaching qualification four years to complete the qualification

- using Swedish/standard rounding when applying the percentage-based qualification requirement
- amending the week-by-week approach of calculating percentage requirements to a
  monthly approach, so that educators can count towards the required percentage if
  they have provided education and care at least once a week or four days within
  each calendar month
- specifying that educators can count towards the percentage requirements on no more than one licence of a service provider over each calendar month.

### Implementation

6. The Amendment Regulations will come into force on 1 June 2022.

# Talking Points for Executive Council: Education (Early Childhood Services) Amendment Regulations (No 2) 2021

### **Proposal**

1. I am seeking the Executive Council's approval to the *Education (Early Childhood Services) Amendment Regulations (No 2) 2021* (the Amendment Regulations).

### Cabinet agreed to a qualified home-based ECE workforce

- In 2018, the Government undertook the Review of Home-based Early Childhood Education. At the time, home-based educators did not need to hold any qualifications. To lift the quality of provision, Cabinet proposed requiring educators to hold a Level 4 ECE qualification.
- 3. Based on consultation feedback, Cabinet agreed to move towards a qualified home-based workforce, with minimum qualification requirements beginning to apply from 1 January 2022.

### Consultation on draft regulations

- 4. In June 2021, Cabinet agreed to consult on draft Amendment Regulations to give effect to this change. Consultation ran from 27 August to 27 September 2021. The feedback was largely positive.
- 5. In response to feedback, implementation of the new requirements will be delayed to 1 June 2022. This is because COVID-19 has compromised some educators' ability to complete a relevant qualification.

### **The Amendment Regulations**

- 6. The Amendment Regulations:
  - create a requirement for educators to hold an approved ECE qualification
  - introduce requirements for unqualified educators to be in training towards a required qualification for up to two years, or in an induction period of up to six months, from 1 January 2025
  - introduce minimum percentages of qualified educators, which will progressively increase over the next four years until 1 January 2025, after which all educators must be either qualified or in training or in induction
  - set parameters around how the minimum percentages of qualified educators will apply, by requiring qualified educators to count if they have provided education and care at least once a week or four days within each calendar month
  - create a requirement for home-based services to maintain a list of educators and evidence of their qualifications for each licence.

### **Implementation**

7. The Amendment Regulations will come into force on 1 June 2022.
