Purpose of Report

This paper seeks your agreement to the Public Trust disbursing \$580,000 to the Council of the University of Auckland, in accordance with the Auckland Education Reserves Act 1912 and the Reserves and Other Lands Disposal Act 1940.

Background

- The Auckland Education Reserves Trust (the Trust) is administered by the Public Trust, and its assets are vested in the Public Trust.
- 2 Section 4 of the Auckland Education Reserves Act 1912 (the 1912 Act) requires the Public Trust to disburse surplus income from certain trust properties in central Auckland to the Council of the University of Auckland (the Council).
- 3 Section 16 (3) of the Reserves and Other Lands Disposal Act 1940 requires the Minister of Education (the Minister) to make an annual determination of the amount to be disbursed to the Council.
- The Council has an ongoing resolution to use the disbursed funds for the purposes outlined in sections 4(a) and 4(b)(i) of the 1912 Act. These require the Council to spend one third of the funds on hostel maintenance and allow two-thirds to be spent on a range of activities to build and improve hostels.
- Each year, the Public Trust writes to inform the Minister of the surplus income amount proposed for disbursement. In March 2021, you approved the previous request to disburse \$514,000 to the Council [METIS 1254127 refers].

Proposed 2022 disbursement

- On 16 December 2021, Audrey Yang (Senior Client Advisor, Public Trust) sent a letter to you and to the Ministry of Education, proposing that you make a determination for the Public Trust to disburse \$580,000 of surplus Trust Income (held as at 30 April 2021) to the Council.
- 7 The Ministry supports the proposed disbursement.

Next steps

- 8 We recommend you authorise the Public Trust to disburse \$580,000 to the Council.
- We have prepared a letter to Audrey Yang on your behalf (attached as Annex 1) to advise her of your decision on the proposed disbursement.
