Background

- 1. Te Ahu o te Reo Māori is aimed at strengthening the te reo Māori capability and proficiency of the education workforce so that all early learning, kura and schools can integrate te reo Māori into the learning of all ākonga in Aotearoa. Thirteen expert providers have been contracted to deliver Te Ahu o te Reo Māori across Te Tai Runga, Te Tai Whenua, and Te Tai Raro. Delivery began in July 2021 and will continue through to 2024.
- 2. Following an extensive request for proposal process, Takapaukura was contracted for National delivery of Te Ahu o te Reo Māori 2021-24 in Te Hiku-o-Te-Ika far north region.

Te Hiku Okoro

- 3. Takapaukura developed their own learning programme, Te Hiku Okoro. The programme provides participants access to Māori language features, rituals, and knowledge specific to the iwi of Te Hiku-o-Te-lka through the context of 'Okoro'; the Te Hiku-specific version of the maramataka Māori, the Māori lunar calendar.
- 4. The Takapaukura team are mana whenua, with links to all iwi within the region's boundaries. Due to these links, they believe it is only appropriate that the philosophies driving Te Hiku Okoro include: Whanaungatanga, Manaakitanga, Kaitiakitanga and Ako.
- 5. Pia (participants) of Te Hiku Okoro receive relevant and purposeful resources and ongoing learning support, including region-wide networking opportunities with the ultimate goal being to create small te reo Māori learning communities and build strong networks between the workforce and the local community, creating opportunities to collaborate for the betterment of our tamariki mokopuna.
- 6. Te Hiku Okoro is delivered in the following areas:
 - Taupō Bay in the East
 - Westwards inland to Mangamuka
 - On to the west coast to cover the Northern side of the Hokianga; and
 - Through to the Far North (Ngātaki and Te Hāpua).

- 7. You have accepted an invitation to attend the graduation ceremony for Te Hiku Okoro on Saturday 9 July, 9.30am 12.30pm, Te Kura Kaupapa Māori o Pukemiro, 14 Norman Senn Avenue, Kaitāia. 96 participants will graduate.
- 8. As per the graduation programme, you are scheduled to deliver a kauwhau at 11.05am (graduation programme attached as Annex 1).
