

The Conference

- 1. You are attending the Post Primary Teacher's Association (PPTA) National Māori Teacher's Conference on 11 July 2021, hosted by Te Huarahi Māori Motuhake (Te Huarahi). Te Huarahi is the national Māori body within the PPTA with responsibility for making decisions that impact Māori members.
- 2. The conference will be held at the Brentwood Hotel, 16 Kemp Street, Kilbirnie. The conference is scheduled to run from Sunday 11 July to Monday 12 July, followed by a morning excursion on Tuesday 13 July.
- 3. You are providing one of the keynote speeches on the opening day at 4.30pm on Sunday 11 July. You have a 30-minute time slot in total for your speech and Q&A session.
- 4. Other keynote speakers on the opening day include Che Wilson, Andrew Judd, and Joby Hopa. Māori Party MPs Rawiri Waititi and Debbie Ngarewa-Packer will be presenting the following day.
- 5. The conference is for Māori kaiako working across the curriculum, including guidance counsellors and transition teachers, teachers of Te Reo Māori and teachers involved in Māori medium education. There will be between 140-150 Māori kaiako attending the conference. Media are not invited.
