## Purpose of Report

1. This paper provides you with a briefing on the agenda items ahead of the Early Childhood Advisory Committee (ECAC) members' meeting on Wednesday, 8 March 2023.

#### Summary

- 2. The purpose of ECAC is to foster a relationship between Government, through the Ministry of Education and the early learning sector to achieve common goals. ECAC is made up of senior representatives from early learning sector organisations and the Ministry of Education.
- 3. You are attending he upcoming ECAC quarterly face to face meeting on Wednesday, 8 March from 10:30am 11:30am, alongside Under-Secretary Jo Luxton MP. The meeting is being held at the Generator complex in the Pūtahi Room, 40 Bowen Street, Wellington. This is located behind Defence House at the rear of Parliament.
- 4. This is an opportunity for you and the Under-Secretary to meet ECAC members, to share information and to hear from them.

#### Background

- 5. ECAC was established to bring employer peak bodies, large providers, and union groups together to provide advice on the operation of early childhood education at a national level.
- 6. The meeting allows organisations to share information; give feedback on proposals by the Government, the Ministry and other government agencies; discuss difficulties and

- opportunities facing the early learning sector; and identify and discuss strategic challenges and opportunities.
- 7. Currently the group includes 30 members who meet four times a year in Wellington, in addition to more regular online operational fortnightly meetings in recent times. A small number of Ministry of Education staff attend both the quarterly and the operational meetings.

### The March 8 ECAC Meeting

- 8. In addition to meeting with you, the following items will be discussed at ECAC on March8:
  - a. Annual ECE Census, Early Learning Participation data and an update (with ERO) on the Early Learning Action Plan evaluation.
  - b. Early Learning Action Plan (ELAP) Update
  - c. The challenges of teacher supply
  - d. Supporting resilience in teams and communities.
- 9. Ministry officials will speak to these agenda items, providing an update or overview on specific streams of work in the Early Learning space. A brief overview of each item is provided for you below.
- 10. A copy of the agenda for this meeting is attached as Annex One.
- 11. The list of ECAC representatives is attached as Annex Two.

#### ECE Census, participation data and the Early Learning Action Plan evaluation

- 12. The Ministry will share key findings from ECE Census 2022 factsheets. There will also be discussion around Early Learning Participation data.
- 13. Following this, we will present the draft 2022 A3 Summary for ELAP, and with ERO, provide an update on the measurements being developed for the ELAP monitoring and evaluation work programme in 2023.

#### Early Learning Action Plan

- 14. Members will be provided with an update on the quarterly activity against the objectives and actions in the Early Learning Action Plan. This quarter the update will include
  - a. An overview on the first month, post the go live, of the ECE Network Management function and an outline of the next steps.
  - a. An update on the last quarter's work on the equity index and the regulations review, including an update on consultation that has just concluded.
  - b. An update on Early Learning Action Plan actions relating to the curriculum.

# Workshops on Teacher Supply and Building Resilience

15. The Teacher Supply workshop will include:

- a. agreeing drivers and current state of demand for qualified teachers
- b. understanding what is currently in play to increase supply of qualified teachers and what else could be considered.
- c. agreeing 1-3 actions as a result of the discussion.
- 16. The Supporting Resilience in Teams and Communities workshop, led by Nicola Woollaston (who represents Hospital Play Specialists on ECAC), will focus on individual's wellbeing and resilience and supporting wellbeing and resilience in centre staff, children and the ECE community.
