Background

 In late 2020 Quinton Hita from Te Taumata Whakahaere requested to formally meet with you to discuss concerns about Te Kawa Matakura and the future delivery of Te Tauranga Kōtuku Rerenga Tahi. You were unable to meet at that time and we undertook to work with your office to reschedule this hui with Te Taumata Whakahaere [METIS 1249578 refers].

Meeting with Te Taumata Whakahaere

2. Your office has arranged a time for you to meet with Te Taumata Whakahaere about the Te Tauranga Kōtuku Rerenga Tahi delivery model. This is scheduled for Friday 9 July, 11.30am – 12.30pm in Kaikohe, venue to be confirmed. We have been working with Te Taumata Whakahaere to prepare a Type Change Application to the New Zealand Qualification Authority (NZQA) to pivot the programme so it better reflects their aspirations and te mātauranga o Te Taitokerau [METIS 1249578 refers].

Te Tauranga Kōtuku Rerenga Tahi Update

- 3. As part of programme delivery and for Ati -ā Toa to successfully complete the programme, a wānanga whakaaturanga has been scheduled for 18 20 June 2021, Te Kura Kaupapa Māori o Whangaroa, Mātauri Bay. The purpose of the two-day wānanga is for Ati ā-Toa to demonstrate their learning to the Ngāio, their whānau and the wider community.
- 4. To celebrate the success of the Ati ā-Toa, Te Taumata Whakahaere propose holding a Pō Whakanui (graduation ceremony) for the first cohort on 16 December 2021 and not June as previously reported [METIS 12244218 refers]. We will update your office with the graduation arrangements and the support that the Ministry will provide at both events.
- 5. Arrangements for both events will be discussed and confirmed at the next Te Taumata Whakahaere Hui scheduled for the end of May. The wānanga and graduation ceremony will be significant milestones celebrating the success of Ati ā-Toa who have completed the programme.
- 6. These will be great opportunities for you to meet the Ati ā-Toa and wider Te Kawa Matakura community, acknowledging their achievement and the contribution of key stakeholders including Ngātiwai, Te Taumata Whakahaere and Te Kāhui Tautoko (teaching and academic team).

7. Should you wish to attend the wānanga whakaaturanga on 18 - 20 June, venue to be confimed, we will work with your office on arrangements.
