- 1. You have accepted an invitation to attend the Pūhoro Internship whakatau and wānanga hosted by the Pūhoro Charitable Trust Board. The event is on 16 November at the Palmerston North Conference and Function Centre (Elwood Room), Palmerston North at 11:30am. - 2. This event celebrates the commencement of Pūhoro rangatahi who begin their summer internships with Crown Research Institutes, Centres of Research Excellence, STEM industry organisations and Universities.
