Background

- 1. The Government has committed to creating more opportunities for all New Zealanders to learn te reo Māori and it being an integral part of all students learning by 2025. As a Treaty partner the government has an obligation to protect and promote te reo Māori as a taonga, guaranteed under the Treaty of Waitangi.
- Following an extensive request for proposal process, 13 providers were contracted to deliver Te Ahu o te Reo Māori nationally for a period of four years, from 2021 to 2024 [METIS 1249982].
- 3. National delivery began on 15 July 2021 at Te Kura Kaupapa Māori o Ngā Mokopuna in Wellington. Following this, we continued to support other roll outs of Te Ahu o te Reo Māori across Aotearoa in the months that followed.
- 4. The first terenga (iteration) of Te Ahu o te Reo Māori is near completion and preparations are underway for graduation ceremonies to occur across the regions.

Graduation Ceremonies

- 5. Graduation ceremonies will provide an opportunity for local iwi and hapū, whānau and communities, along with our regional providers and the Ministry, to celebrate the commitment and achievements of Te Ahu o te Reo Māori participants. Ceremonies will also encourage graduates to become advocates of te reo Māori in schools, kura, early learning centres and communities.
- 6. Several graduation ceremonies will be held in each region led by regional providers. Each graduation ceremony will be a bespoke occasion and will vary in venue type, length, and order of proceedings. While these details have not yet been confirmed, Table 1 provides you with the confirmed dates for upcoming graduation ceremonies.

- 7. There are two graduation ceremonies that are still to be confirmed by Eastern Institute of Technology and Te Rito Maioha (Te Tairāwhiti). We anticipate that all graduation ceremonies for the first terenga will be completed by July 2022.
- 8. It is the intent to hold graduation ceremonies face-to-face whilst adhering to regional Covid-19 alert level restrictions. If face-to-face ceremonies do not occur based on changes to alert level settings, providers will either postpone ceremonies or proceed online.

Graduation Certificates

- 9. For all ceremonies, graduates will receive a personalised graduation certificate, a Te Ahu o te Reo Māori lapel badge and each of the providers will be presenting a taonga that they have designed to acknowledge their success.
- 10. With an anticipated 1500 graduates for this iteration of Te Ahu o te Reo Māori, we would like to test your level of comfort for signing all certificates electronically.
- 11. Attached as Annex 1 is a sample of the graduation certificates presented during the testing phase of Te Ahu o te Reo Māori. For the upcoming ceremonies, the certificate will be similar in look and feel with your signature block positioned appropriately



alongside other signatories as deemed appropriate by providers. The certificates will be pre-printed by the Ministry and then delivered to the providers.

Next Steps

- 12. We will liaise with your office regarding your availability to attend confirmed graduation ceremonies and continue to update your office as new graduation dates are confirmed.
- 13. We will work with relevant providers and your office to make all necessary arrangements including speech notes and a run sheet outlining the day's proceedings once we receive confirmation of whether you will be attending any of these.
- 14. A briefing note outlining the insights received about the first terenga of Te Ahu o te Reo Māori national delivery will be provided to your office on 17 November 2021. This will include statistical information and key findings as a result of provider oral reports.
- 15. Acknowledging participant success and socialising the benefits and value of Te Ahu o te Reo Māori is ongoing. Our Mōu te Reo communication strategy will continue to leverage off the achievements from the first terenga and add value for marketing and recruitment purposes for 2022 intake.

Proactive Release

16. We recommend that this report is proactively released as per your expectation that information be released as soon as possible. Any information which may need to be withheld will be done so in line with the provisions of the Official Information Act 1982.
