


Background

- 1. As you are aware, the Government considered it important that there was additional funding for kōhanga reo to sit alongside the pay parity funding recently announced for education and care services to pay their certificated teachers' closer to the rates paid to kindergarten teachers.
- 2. Government has therefore set aside about \$12 million for kōhanga reo. It is a pro-rated amount based on the number of child hours the government funds education and care services compared to kōhanga reo.
- 3. The overall announcement on early learning pay parity was made by the Minister of Education on Wednesday 12 May. As part of this announcement, it was made clear that funding had been also been set aside to improve pay in k\u00f6hanga reo. The amount of funding set aside for k\u00f6hanga was not disclosed (for the reasons discussed with you last week) but instead it was made clear that the Crown (through the Ministry) would work with Te K\u00f6hanga Reo National Trust to agree how best to make this funding work to improve pay in k\u00f6hanga reo.



Discussions with kohanga reo

6. Officials from the Ministry of Education have been in touch with Angus Hartley (Tumu Whakarae of the Trust) about this funding to ensure the Trust understood provision had been made for kōhanga and that there will need to be discussion and agreement between the Crown and the Trust about how the funding is applied before it is released. We are scheduled to meet face to face with Angus and his staff on Tuesday 18 May.



Next steps

- 9. As noted above we are scheduled to meet with the Trust next week to begin the engagement process on this. We will keep you up to date with how that develops.
