### Caveats:

- i. Data is live and subject to change
- ii. 2021 data is up to date of extraction – 20/07/2021
- iii. Numbers under 5 have been masked with “x” to protect the privacy of students. Numbers greater than or equal to 5 have also been masked with “>=5” if unmasked, data would lead to deducing the other masked values.
- iv. An exclusion means the formal removal of a student aged under 16 from the school by the school board and there is a legal requirement that the student is enrolled in education.
- v. Figures show the numbers of exclusions, not the numbers of students. Students are included more than once in the tables if they have had more than one exclusion.
- vi. It is important to note that exclusions are not measures of student behaviour but measures of a school’s reaction to such behaviours. What one school may choose to exclude for, another may not. The number of these events should not be used as a proxy measure for total student behaviour.
