

Thank you for your email of 18 January 2024 to the Ministry of Education (the Ministry) requesting the following information:

- The number of teacher vacancies there have been nationwide on the starting day (or closest recorded equivalent – eg. For each end of January of the year) of each school year since 2019.
- Please include the figure for 2024 from January 29<sup>th</sup>, which I acknowledge is 11 days' time from receipt of this email so I will accept a extended response time beyond the 20 working day period.

Your request has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

I am refusing your request in full under 18(g) of the Act, as the Ministry does not hold data on teacher vacancies. Vacancies are managed independently by schools, and we have no grounds for believing that a comprehensive list of teacher vacancies is either held by, or more closely related to the functions of another department or organisation subject to the Act.

Schools are required to advertise permanent vacancies in the Education Gazette. The Ministry uses this database to calculate the number of *new* vacancies listed in each fortnightly payroll cycle, but there are known limitations with this data. For example, this data only tells us if a role was advertised. It does not tell us if the role was filled, nor does it provide any data about the teachers applying for the roles, i.e. whether they may be returning to the workforce or moving from one teaching role to another.

The Education Gazette data for the time period 2019 to 2023 can be found in the below Table One. Per our clarification email of 26 January 2024, the data is for teacher positions in the primary and secondary school sector only.

## Notes:

- Data is for advertised positions in the primary and secondary sectors only.
- Some positions may be double counted in the data as schools may advertise open positions more than once.
- Some positions are likely to be for future vacancies as schools may advertise open positions well ahead of time.
- Data was captured at the start of each school year.

Positions advertised in the Education Gazette expressed as a proportion of regular teacher numbers are 18.9% in 2022 compared to 19.6% in 2019. Although the number of advertisements is similar, there were more teachers in 2022 (63,739) compared to 61,764 in 2019. Teacher numbers for 2023 will be released on Education Counts in mid-2024.
