Dear

Thank you for your letter of 15 March 2019 to the Ministry of Education requesting the following information:

- 1. What percentage and actual number of secondary school students living in the Aranui High School catchment area/zone attended Aranui High School from 1990 2016 (using the years 1990, 1995, 2000, 2005, 2010, 2015, 2016, as data points)
- 2. For students in the catchment area who did **not** enrol at Aranui High School, which schools did they enrol at instead (percentage and number for each secondary school attended) (using the years 1990, 1995, 2000, 2005, 2010, 2015, 2016, as data points)
- 3. How the Ministry of Education defined the Aranui High School zone/catchment area, and if this zone/catchment area changed over the period of 1990 2016.

Your request has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

As you may be aware, Aranui High School did not have an enrolment scheme while it operated.

The Catchment area used for analysis is defined as the combined catchment areas of the primary schools for which Haeata Community College is the local state secondary provider. This largely reflects the combined catchment areas of the primary schools for which Aranui High School was the closest state secondary provider.

The area used for analysis is shown in the map attached as **Appendix A**.

Please note that Haeata Community College is currently consulting on the design of an enrolment scheme, including a Year 1-8 and Year 9-13 home zone. The proposed Year 9-13 home zone matches the catchment area used for this analysis.

Student address data is sourced from School Roll Returns, which are official datasets provided to the Ministry by schools. Where an electronic return has been received directly from a school's student management system, student address data is able to be accessed. Where these addresses are recorded correctly, they may be able to be mapped, providing geospatial data for analysis such as this. Prior to 2005, many schools submitted paper roll return summaries, as they did not utilise an electronic student management system.

Therefore, I am refusing part of your request for data for 1990, 1995 or 2000 under section 18(f) of the Act as the information requested cannot be made available without substantial collation or research.

The following table shows the number of Year 9-13 full-time, Ministry-funded (i.e. excluding International) students in the catchment area by school of enrolment. All school types and authorities (State, State Integrated, and Private) are included.

Note that Part time students with a Full Time Equivalent (FTE) value less than 0.5 are excluded from the 2015 and 2016 datasets used for this analysis. In recent years, a large number of part time (often Adult) students have enrolled at some secondary schools (particularly at Hagley Community College) to access the courses available there. Inclusion of these part time students would artificially increase measures of local demand.
