Thank you for your letter received on 8 April 2019 to the Ministry of Education requesting the following information:

- 1. the gender of those teachers who have gained In-school, Across-school and Principal leadership positions in Communities of Learning/Kahui Ako in New Zealand primary and secondary schools since their inception.
- the gender of those teachers who have been given leadership roles in the Ministry of Education's Communities of Learning/Kahui Ako in primary and secondary schools since the first Community of Learning/Kahui Ako was formed in 2015.

Your request has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

Below please find the headcount of teachers who have gained In-school, Across-school and Principal leadership positions in Kahui Ako in New Zealand primary and secondary schools since their inception in 2015 (broken down by gender):

Gender	Headcount of Teachers
Female	3,516
Male	1,075
Overall	4,595

Please note the following caveats:

- The data was extracted on 26 April 2019. It is subject to change and may differ if rerun at a later date. This is because payroll information changes fortnightly and the number of Kāhui Ako appointments is constantly growing.
- Primary schools have been defined as schools with a school type of Contributing, Intermediate or Full Primary. Secondary schools have been defined as schools with a school type of Composite, Restricted Composite, Secondary (Year 7-15) or Secondary (Year 9-15). The data provided only includes teachers at primary or secondary schools as per these definitions.

Gender is not a compulsory field to select when teachers are registering their details.
Therefore, details can be submitted with no gender selected.
