Portfolios Education / Associate Education (Hon Tracey Martin)

On 22 June 2020, Cabinet:

- noted that, on 11 May 2020, Cabinet approved the Increasing Wellbeing and Mental Health Support to Learners and Education Workforce initiative and associated appropriation changes, including a pilot of guidance counselling in primary schools and an increase to the guidance staffing entitlement for schools and kura with over 200 secondary students [CAB-20-MIN-0219.09, Initiative 12675 refers];
- agreed to rescind those parts of the decision relating to including a pilot of guidance counselling in primary schools and an increase to the guidance staffing entitlement for schools and kura with over 200 secondary students;
- agreed, instead, to include funding to support community organisations to provide guidance counselling for primary and secondary students and an increase to the guidance staffing entitlement targeted towards larger secondary schools;
- 4 **agreed** to the following new initiative description for the Increasing Wellbeing and Mental Health Support to Learners and Education Workforce initiative:

This initiative will provide funding to increase the provision of wellbeing and mental health support to learners and the education workforce in response to COVID-19. Initiatives include: funding to support community organisations to provide guidance counselling for primary and secondary students; an increase to the guidance staffing entitlement targeted towards larger schools; the establishment of an urgent response fund for early learning services, schools and kura; the embedding of quality teaching approaches to mental health, wellbeing and healthy relationships in schools, kura and early learning services; increased access to workplace assistance for educators; strengthening mental health services for tertiary students; and local responses to youth mental health and wellbeing. Led by the Minister of Education;

5 **noted** that the policy decision in paragraph 3 above requires a transfer of non-departmental funding to departmental funding in order for the Ministry of Education to administer the contracts with community organisations;

approved the following fiscally neutral adjustments to give effect to the policy decision in paragraph 3 above, with no impact on the operating balance and net core Crown debt:
