- Correspondence with [Arowhenua Māori School], in particular any requests or formal bids for funding or improvements.

You also agreed to a clarified time frame of 1 January 2017 to 31 December 2018.

Your request has been considered under the Official Information Act 1982 (the Act).

#### Purpose

This memo is to inform you that:

 According to recent demographic analysis Arowhenua Māori School meets eligibility for an additional teaching space

#### **Background**

As at July 2017 Arowhenua Māori School was the only provider of Māori Medium Education (MME) at Level 2. In the previous year, two other schools offered Level 3 MME.

The Ministry supported a District wide project that intended to develop and enhance language acquisition by developing access and resources for schools. The early focus of this work was the

growth of provision at lower levels with the ultimate goal to develop capacity and capability to deliver at higher levels; and foster increased demand for schooling in te reo.

The Ministry of Education are currently in discussion with Arowhenua Māori School about establishing an enrolment scheme. The scheme would include a special programme for bi-lingual Te Reo at the school.

The level of provision meets the property policy<sup>2</sup> for funding teaching spaces (Level 3 and higher).

Current Situation (source: I:\X Schools - Individual\A - E\Arowhenua\enrolment scheme\Arowhenua Local demand.msg)

A total of 56 student records were able to be mapped from the March 2018 Arowhenua Māori School roll return. Of these students seven (13%) were living within the school's Transport Entitlement Zone (TEZ), 21 (38%) came from the Temuka township and 21 (38%) from the Timaru township. The remaining 73 local year 1-8 students in the schools TEZ were enrolled at other local schools.

Arowhenua Māori School currently has two teaching spaces and was operating at 140% utilisation (October 2017). The March 2018 roll was 61 – 19 more students than in March 2017.

A capacity to demand ratio is used to express the total local demand for a school compared to the capacity available at the school. This measure helps ensure we are not providing more capacity at a school than is needed to meet the demand for local students.

With a capacity to demand ratio of 0.5 the school would not have enough space to accommodate all state school students if they decided to attend. At March 2018 seven (9%) of local students attended Arowhenua Maori School (local state school market share).

The majority of the roll is made up of students travelling from other school catchments to access Māori medium education provide at Arowhenua Māori School. A more appropriate assessment of the capacity to be provided at Arowhenua Māori School is the percentage of student spaces provided compared to the number of Māori students in the District. This comparison does not take into account non-Māori students that also access MME and consequently understates likely demand.

The number of Māori students in Timaru District has grown from 917 in July 2013 to 1,164 students in July 2017. The table below shows the number of Māori students enrolled at schools within Timaru District (territorial authority boundary) and their enrolment of Māori language immersion levels in 2017. Note that the percentages refer to the proportion of time spent teaching in Te Reo.

This shows that in 2017 4% of Māori students in Timaru District were enrolled in Level 2 provision (and none at Level 1).

There has been a 21% growth in the number of Māori students at schools in the Timaru District between 2013 and 2017. Recent roll growth at Arowhenua Māori School reflects increased demand for Level 2 MME from whānau across the District. The roll currently exceeds capacity of the school with this now a limiting factor to students access MME.

Providing more capacity for Level 2 MME will improve access to Te Reo provision and ensure teaching space is the not limiting factor for this provision.

The following table shows the various build capacity and what this would provide as a percentage of the total number of Māori students (as at July 2017).

Build Capacity: is the projected number of students the school will need to accommodate in 2023 (five-year projection).

Master Planning Capacity: is an estimate of the greatest projected number of students the school will need to cater for in the long term.

The recommended build capacity will meet current demand and provide for a fourth teaching space to accommodate further roll growth. The 80 student spaces represent around 7% of Māori students in the District.

#### How will property deliver this?

The funding of roll growth is proposed to be combined with a re-development project. The majority of existing school property will be rebuilt and master planned for a possible future roll of 160 students.

#### Inclusion on the roll growth funding prioritisation schedule

The recommended build capacity of 80 would require funding for two roll growth teaching spaces. Arowhenua Māori School has already been included in the national roll growth funding prioritisation schedule.

Addition to the schedule will not guarantee funding for roll growth will be allocated to this school as the national prioritisation process determines allocation.

#### Summary

- a) Arowhenua Māori School's October 2017 roll was 56 with the school operating at 140% utilisation.
- b) Discussions have been held with the school regarding the implementation of an enrolment scheme. The scheme would include a special programme that outlined the criteria for enrolment into the bi-lingual classes.
- c) The roll is anticipated to remain above the current capacity of 40 student spaces.
- d) A build capacity of 80 is recommended which will require roll growth funding for two teaching space. This improve access to bi-lingual provision in the Timaru District.
- e) Arowhenua Māori School has been added to the national roll growth funding prioritisation schedule for consideration in Budget 2018.
- f) The Master Planning capacity is 160 student spaces
